Course Overview:

This course provides a forum for discussing the changes affecting Tribal communities, their traditional assets and resources, and lays out a framework for enhancing resilience. Instructors offer methods, resources, and practices that respect the sovereignty, culture, and traditions of Tribal Nations while preventing and mitigating threats, hazards, and adverse impacts to their community resilience. Participant-led discussions facilitate self-determined pathways for improving resilience. Recent success stories from various Tribal Nations are shared and discussed. Participants complete the course with timely resources.

Course Scope:

This course provides participants with a forum to discuss and determine culturally relevant and self-determined methods for improving resilience. Participants will gain knowledge into available resources, tools, frameworks, and resilience indicators.

Target Audience:

Those responsible for implementing Tribal Government emergency management programs, planners, public works, and other leaders who may be engaged in investments in people and infrastructure, emergency managers, Tribal Government department leaders, and responders.

Course Core Capabilities:

- Discuss changes that are impacting Tribal Nations.
- Determine framework, methods, and resources for enhancing community resilience.
- Determine long-term vulnerability reduction actions that could strengthen community resilience.
